EXPLANATION OF PERFORMANCE

Performance/Means and Strategies

The Lead Reduction Initiative is a new \$25 million competitive grant program focused on making homes lead safe for low-income children. This initiative will demonstrate innovative local approaches that are results oriented and cost effective and will serve as models for wider use of these methodologies. The program will include careful evaluation of the program efforts to identify the most promising strategies and these will also be used to further the performance of HUD's main lead hazard program. The program will allow for wide flexible use of the funds at local discretion. Under this initiative, communities would be able to develop a program, such as a window-replacement program to address such specific local problems.

Resource Management Information

The Office of Healthy Homes and Lead-Hazard Control may administer or help administer the Lead Hazard Initiative and it will likely be accommodated by shifting existing staff.
