Grants were competitively awarded to eligible recipients: local rural non-profit organizations, community development corporations, Indian tribes, state housing finance agencies, and state economic development and federally recognized community development agencies.

The Department's proposal to terminate the RHED program reflects the belief that these efforts can continue to be pursued through existing HUD Community Development Block Grant and HOME programs. Additionally, the U.S. Department of Agriculture manages a portfolio of rural housing and economic development grants programs that vastly exceed HUD's RHED program in terms of programs and services from budget to staffing.
