### NOTE

In comparing the unit and outlay estimate in this justification with those shown in the fiscal year 2002 justification for Housing Payments, it should be noted that fiscal year 2004 totals <u>include</u> estimates for the Section 202/811 programs, while those programs were specifically <u>excluded</u> from budget estimates prior to the fiscal year 2002 Budget. Consequently, the totals shown for Housing Payments in this justification are significantly higher than in the past.
