Summary Statement

The Budget proposes to consolidate funding for Rural Housing and Economic Development (RHED) into a new program within the Department of Commerce.

The RHED program was legislated originally to encourage new and innovative approaches to serving the housing and economic development needs of the nation's rural communities, including capacity building activities. Grants were competitively awarded to eligible recipients: local rural non-profit organizations, community development corporations, Indian tribes, state housing finance agencies, and state economic development and federally recognized community development agencies.

Proposed Actions

No fiscal year 2006 funding is proposed for the RHED program. Outlays remain level from fiscal year 2005 to fiscal year 2006 as previous rounds of funding continue to spend out. The Department's proposal to terminate the RHED program reflects the belief that these efforts can continue to be pursued through existing HUD, HOME and other programs and through the integrated community development effort located in the Department of Commerce. Additionally, the U.S. Department of Agriculture manages a portfolio of rural housing and economic development grants programs that vastly exceed HUD's RHED program in terms of programs and services from budget to staffing.

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The RHED program was evaluated during fiscal year 2004. The evaluation found that the program that was rated had a clear purpose and design and decent strategic planning, but needed improvements in program management and results.
