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Note to Applicants: These measures are intended to serve only as a guide for applicants to both the ROSS program and the Neighborhood Networks program. Some measures listed herein may not be applicable to the specific program to which you are applying.

- Percent of eligible families who participate in ROSS or Neighborhood Networks (NN)-funded training
- Increase in the number of eligible families served by ROSS or NN-funded training
- Number of new services provided by the ROSS or NN grant
- Percentage of elderly and handicapped residents receiving supportive services
- Number of residents receiving counseling from program coordinators
- Number of families who received housing counseling
- Percent of counseled families who moved to market rate units
- Percent of counseled families who buy a home
- Number of residents who received job training in the first year (or second, or third year, etc.) of the grant
- Number of residents who received job placement assistance
- Percentage of residents in developments being served by a ROSS or NN grant that enrolled in job training
- Percentage of residents in developments being served by a ROSS or NN grant that completed job training
- Number of residents participating in job training programs whose salaries increased
- Number of youth residents in developments being served by a ROSS or NN grant that -enrolled in ROSS or NN-funded after-school programs.
- Number of residents who participated in job training courses offered through the Neighborhood Networks computer center
- Percent of eligible households that use the Neighborhood Networks center on a weekly basis
- Number of partnerships created with local employers or social service providers
