
Application Submittal Information


- Grants.gov must *receive and*validate all applications by 11:59:59

 PM on deadline date, <u>June 7, 2006</u>
- Waiver request must be submitted to OFIFILFIC no later than 15 days before the application deadline
 - -If granted, HUD must receive paper applications by due date: no 15-day grace period

Application Submittal Information

- Form HUD-96011, fax cover page, required for faxed documents
 - Do not place another fax cover on top
 - -Failure to use form HUD-96011 will result in faxed information not being reviewed

Rating Factor 2: Need and Extent of Problem

- Document critical need in Target Area
 - -Economic and demographic data
 - -Rates of childhood illness
 - -Age and condition of housing
 - -Percent of Low- and Very Low-Income Families

- Use "Model for Implementation"
- Technical approach: methods, schedules, milestones-IRB, HIPAA
- Project activities: select targeted housing, children under 72 months old, integrate safe work practices

- Meaningful community involvement
- Potential impediments to recruitment and retention;
 strategies to overcome them
- Assessment tools, specialized testing, cost-effective interventions

- Identify potential health outcomes
- · Referral and case management
- NO medical costs permitted
- Financing strategies, affirmation of fair housing laws

- Training and education of staff, parents, grassroots communitybased non-profit organizations, including faith based organizations
- Include HUD's departmental priorities



- Define project goals and objectives
- Provide economic opportunity
- · Adequate budget justification

- Create project flow chart and complete Logic Model early in process-allow time for implementation
- Have realistic goals and outcome measures (e.g., # of recruits)
- Plan on cost-effective intervention measures

Rating Factor 4: Leveraging Resources

- Develop partnerships or consortia to secure additional resources
- Coordinate with other housingrelated activities/organizations
- Demonstrate potential to become self-sufficient

Rating Factor 4: Leveraging Resources (cont.)

- Match Not Required
- Commitment Letters must include:
 - -type (cash or in-kind)
 - inpents
 - eggrevel no natch or leverage
 - mergorq ni seuv
 - -Must be signed by individual with fiscal authority



Rating Factor 5: Achieving Results and Program Evaluation

- Performance goals and outcome measures-including health outcomes
- Critical milestones and method for assuring accountability

HUD's Logic Model

Logic Model contains drop down listings of need statements, activities / outputs and outcomes:

- Select need statement you plan to address
- Complete just need, activity / output, and projected outcome tables with application

HUD's Logic Model (cont.)

- Reporting requirements apply only to grantees
- Return on Investment statement and calculation not required for application
 - HUD will issue Federal
 Register Notice regarding
 Return on Investment
