

- We hope you are thinking, "Let's apply for a grant this year!"
 - Before deciding, please read at least the "Purpose" of all of the OHILHC'S NOFA's and determine which one best fits your proposed project

- For projects involving Information

 Dissemination and Communication via
 - -Community Outreach,
 - -Training and Education, or
 - Technical Assistance (New*)
- Consider applying under this NOFA

What's New: Eligible Applicants

- Academic and not-for-profit institutions in U.S.
- Certain state and local governments, and federally recognized Tribes
- For-profit firms, no fee (profit) allowed (*new)

What's New: Ineligible Applicants

- Existing OHHLHC grantees or applicants to the following programs are not eligible to apply under this NOFA as applicants, subrecipients, or subcontractors:
 - Lead hazard control
 - Lead hazard reduction demonstration
 - LEAP
 - Lead Technical Studies

What's New: Match

- Requires 10% match commitment by applicant
- Leveraging of funds is encouraged
- See OHHLHC's match and leverage guidance posted at: www.hud.gov/offices/lead

Lead Outreach NOFA Amount and Type of Funding:

- Approximately \$2 million available
- Approximately 8-10 awards
- Alwards will be cooperative agreements, not grants
- Period of performance is 24 months

Application Submittal Information

- Grants.gov must *receive and*validate all applications by 11:59:59

 PM on deadline date, <u>June 6, 2006</u>
- Waiver request must be submitted to OHHILHC no later than 15 days before the application deadline
- If granted, HUD must receive paper applications by due date: no 15-day grace period





- 1. Increase awareness of lead poisoning prevention
- 2. Educate tenants and owners to recognize lead hazards and report them
- 3. Build capacity of leadtrained construction workers
- 4. Provide technical assistance to certain Officies

What's New:

- Unit assessments and blood testing are not allowed under this NOFA
- Referral or enrollment
 of units in treatment
 program is not required

What's New:

- 10% Match Required
 - -Matching funds may be cash or in-kind (non-cash)
 - Match contributions
 Match contributions

Eligible Activities

- Three specific categories of activities
 - 1. Information dissemination
 - 2. Training and education
 - 3. Technical assistance
 - If an activity is not listed as eligible under a category, it may not be performed

Eligible Activity Category #1: Outreach

- Approximately \$1.2 M available (about 5 awards)
- Goal to raise public awareness of lead poisoning prevention
- Results of information dissemination must be measured



- Eligible outreach activities include:
 - Door-to-door canvasses
 - Community meetings/visits
 - Earned media (PSAs, etc.)
 - Advertising
 - Development and use of phone/email hotlines and websites
 - Making materials available in alternative formats (Braille, audio, etc.)
 - Program administration and evaluation

- Eligible Activity Category #2: Training and Education
- Approximately \$400,000 available in 2 cooperative agreements
- Training of local residents, contractors, retail sales associates, tenants, owners, housing inspectors and others on Lead Disclosure Rule and Lead Safe Housing Rule, etc.



- Eligible training and education activities include:
 - -Delivery of HUD- (or stateapproved) lead safe work practices training curricula
 - -Training regional/local residents and businesses
 - -Promoting or marketing training course deliveries
 - -Auditing and evaluating training

- Eligible Activity Category #3: Technical Assistance (TA)
- Approximately \$400,000 available (approximately 2 cooperative agreements)
- Awardees will provide TA to OHHLHC's lead grantees on grant management and lead technical issues

Eligible Activity Category #3: TA, cont'd.

- TA applicants may only apply for:
 - The nation as a whole or
 - One or more of three regional geographic areas:
 - -Eastern US
 - -Central US
 - Western US

- Eligible TA Activities include:
 - Provide technical or programmatic assistance to grantees, sub-grantees and contractors of OHHLHC's grant programs
 - -Maintain liaison with HUD's GTR/GTM
 - Review grantee records as appropriate
 - Making recommendations
 - -Report writing

Other General Requirements

- All activities must assist the regional/local area to develop or implement a strategy to eliminate lead poisoning, target at-risk areas/populations
- All awardees must provide information to owners and low-income occupants about regional/local sources for lead nazard control and rehabilitation programs.

- Other General Requirements, cont'd.
- All awardees are required to use a project management tool, such as a Logic Model, to manage their projects

- Content and Form of Submission
 - Narrative response to 5 rating factors may not exceed 25 pages
 - Leredmun ed teum segeg II/A-
 - -All material that is not properly located, referenced and discussed in the proper place in the application will not be reviewed. (Section IV.B.)

• Materials other than those specified as allowable will not be reviewed.

NOFA provides
 checklist of application
 contents

- Rating Process and Factors
 - -Application Review Panel will review all eligible applications
 - -Awards will be made in rank order within the limits of funding availability
 - -75 points needed to be considered for funding

- 1. Organizational Capacity 20 points
- 2. Need/Extent of Problem 10 points
- 3. Soundness of Approach 40 points
- 4. Leveraging Resources 15 points
- 5. Achieving Results and Program evaluation

Rating Factor #1: Capacity of Organization and Relevant Organizational Experience — 20 points

A. Organizational capacity

B. Organizational experience

C. Individual qualifications

D. Past performance

Note: This factor requires a projectspecific organizational chart (also referred to as a "process flow diagram")

- Rating Factor #2:
 Need/Extent of the
 Problem 10 points
 - A. Current data required (within 5 years)
 - B. Data must be specific to target area

- Rating Factor #3:
 Soundness of Approach —
 40 points
- A. Project goals
- B. Work plan
- C. Budget and justification
- D. For outreach and training applicants only, institutionalization or mainstreaming lead safety into its programs



How to Protect Your Children from Lead Poisoning All awardees must use existing HUD-approved outreach, training and/or technical assistance documents unless they adequately justify the need to create new ones.

- Rating Factor #4: Leveraging Resources 15 points (title of RF was omitted in Federal Register)
 - -Ability to contribute matching resources from applicant's organization
 - Ability to leverage funds from entities other than applicant.

- =10% match required
- -Leveraging is not required.
- -Higher points will be awarded to higher percentages of allowable matched and/or leveraged resources

- Rating Factor #5:
 Achieving Results and Program Evaluation —
 15 points
 - Benefits, Outputs,
 Outcomes of proposed project
 - -Logic Model

HUD's Logic Model

Logic Model contains drop down listings of need statements, activities / outputs and outcomes:

- Select need statement you plan to address
- Complete just need, activity / output, and projected outcome tables with application

HUD's Logic Model (cont.)

- Reporting requirements apply only to grantees
- Return on Investment statement and calculation not required for application
 - HUD will issue Federal Register Notice regarding Return on Investment
