This notice announces that HUD has posted on <a href="www.Grants.gov">www.Grants.gov</a> a technical correction that clarifies and corrects errors in a threshold requirement, the qualifications for persons who conduct asthma education, and a rating subfactor.

## SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

On September 22, 2010, HUD posted on <a href="www.Grants.gov">www.Grants.gov</a> its Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for HUD's FY2010 Asthma Interventions in Public and Assisted

Multifamily Housing Grant Program. The NOFA made approximately \$2.6 million available, by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2010 (Pub. L. 111-117, approved December 16, 2009). The posted NOFA contained three errors that HUD is seeking to correct. For the convenience of applicants, a revised version of the NOFA will be posted and can be found and downloaded from <a href="https://www.Grants.gov">www.Grants.gov</a>, using the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number for the Asthma Interventions in Public and Assisted Multifamily Housing Grant Program, 14.914. <a href="https://www.Grants.gov">Corrections</a>.

- 1. On page 7, in section III.C.1.b, in the second line, the requirement for applicants to identify certain project information omitted "optionally" before "in your abstract". The threshold requirement to provide that information in the response to Rating Factor 2 remains unchanged. As a result, the first sentence of section III.C.1.b. is corrected to read as follows:
- "b. To receive an award of funds from HUD, you must identify the following in your response to Rating Factor 2 (Need and Extent of the Problem) and optionally in your abstract: the target area of your intervention, the target age group, and the current asthma prevalence among the target age group in the community your target area is in (in this context, this is the smallest geographic area including your target area for which reliable data are available) and, in at least your response to Rating Factor 2, cite documentary support for the prevalence value."
- 2. On page 8, in section III.C.2.c, regarding asthma education, the paragraph described the qualifications of the supervisors of such education but, inadvertently, not the qualifications of the educators. The paragraph is revised to read as follows:
- "c. <u>Asthma Education:</u> Any asthma education must be supervised by a Certified Asthma Educator as designated by the National Asthma Educator Certification Board, and conducted by

either such Educators or individuals with appropriate training and demonstrated successful experience in asthma education."

3. •n page 17, in section V.A.3.a(3), in the first line, subfactor 1.3 of Rating Factor 1 should have a maximum score of 4 points rather than 3. The total number of points for Rating Factor 1 is stated correctly on page 16, in section V.A.3.a, in the first line, as 22 points, but the total of its subfactors is only 21 points as a result of the typographical error for subfactor 1.3.
