\$65,821

The drug elimination plan at Little Dipper Apartments includes drug prevention, intervention and education. The prevention component includes the installation of security cameras, motion detection, halogen lighting, security system for one bedroom buildings, renovate and expand the community room, construct community areas, install playground equipment, fencing, and locked gates. The intervention component includes partnerships with Fairbanks Native Association and Boys and Girls Club of Tanana Valley who provide services to develop leadership skills through recreation, mentors and drug prevention and treatment activities. The education component includes a partnership with Fairnet, Inc., a computer training center and the Literacy Council. These non-profit organizations provide tutoring programs for children, teens, and adults and learning opportunities with potential employment outcomes through shadowing and mentoring, also VISTA/LIFE which coordinates workshops to train in areas of self sufficiency.

Forest Hills Village drug elimination program includes education, drug prevention and intervention. The education component includes, but not limited to a partnership with Jefferson County Committee for Economic Opportunity and the Forest Hills Village Network Center. The prevention component includes the installation of additional security cameras, vandal proof breezeway lighting, motion detection lighting and fencing off adjacent traffic area. The intervention component includes partnerships with the Boys and Girls Club, Integrity Safety Investigations, Family Skills Center and Birmingham Area Private Council Welfare-to-Work Program.

The drug elimination plan at Dauphin Gate Apartments includes drug prevention. The proposed fencing is the same 8 foot ornamental iron used on the Northern and Western perimeter whose purchase was provided by the 1996 Drug Elimination Grant. The grant will also continue the high profile resident activity program with its drug abuse and crime prevention components. This grant will continue the great progress made with drug elimination and also will help deter drug-related crime, violence and vandalism by giving residents opportunities to reclaim their neighborhood.

Piney Woods Apartments' Drug Elimination Plan includes drug prevention and intervention. The grant will help complete the installation of wrought iron fencing along the East and Southwest sides of the complex, install vandal-proof breeze way lights, area pole lights, motion detection lights, security cameras, and playground equipment. The intervention component includes partnership with *The Weed and Seed Program*, The Citizen's Girls and Boys Club, and the Dollarway School District which will provide services to develop leadership skills through mentors and drug prevention activities.

Chicanos Por La Causa will use this drug elimination grant to support physical improvements that will enhance security include upgrading playgrounds, and installing motion activated lighting. Centro de Amistad will provide early intervention and referral programs. The drug education, prevention will be conducted by partner agencies including the Town of Guadalupe's Youth Volunteer Service Corps. The East Valley Boys and Girls Club, Guadalupe Branch will also participate and offer SMART Moves programs. Programs will include tutoring, mentoring, peer leadership development and alternative recreational activities. Housing Authority of the City of Calexico

\$125,000

The Housing Authority of the City of Calexico is committed to the development and implementation of programs that promote a drug-free living environment. The grant will help continue the Housing Authority's existing Drug Elimination Program called *Expanding Opportunities through Broadened Paths*. Their Action Plan involves the extensive use of existing community resources and the creation of both formal and informal linkages with expert community service agents to offer education, prevention and intervention activities as well as community policing involvement with an emphasis on economic development and self-sufficiency.

Los Angeles

Skid Row Housing Trust

\$200,000

The Skid Row Housing Trust's Drug Elimination Program will provide supportive services, educational and economic opportunities, and tenant improvements to create a general meeting space for residents of the Skid Row Housing Trust's St. Mark's and Crescent Hotels. The services and meeting space will be located in two storefronts adjacent to the Crescent Hotel called the Service Spot. The Service Spot is designed to discourage drug use and crime in the immediate area. The Space would be reconfigured to include a meeting room and sober lounge, a computer lab, and office space for Resident Service staff. The meeting room will allow for the Los Angeles Police Department to facilitate community forums aimed at discussing drug related crime issues, establishing a positive relationship with residents, and designing effective drug and crime intervention strategies. The Drug Elimination Program will provide stipends for resident internships. Four internships positions will be created to provide residents with on-the-job experience including: Office Assistant, Computer Lab Assistant, Peer Outreach Assistant, and Peer Group Facilitator. Internships will be geared toward the reintegration of residents by providing internship coordination, case management, referrals to drug treatment programs, benefits advocacy, transportation assistance and support group facilitation.

Los Angeles

The Housing Authority of Los Angeles County

The drug elimination program at Ujima Village is focused on prevention and intervention activities that include: drug and violence prevention education, recreational opportunities, counseling, and enhanced communication through a Neighborhood Network Center. Implementation strategies are multi-faceted to offer enrichment opportunities such as computer literacy and personal development, and technical assistance in job preparation and referrals. The San Diego Housing Commission's Multifamily Drug Elimination Program will use a comprehensive security and prevention-based approach to reduce and eliminate drug and gang-related crime at the University Canyon complex. Normandy Apartments, Ltd.

The drug elimination grant will provide a holistic approach to eradicating the drugs and drug-related crime that is in and around Normandy Apartments. The drug elimination plan at includes physical improvements, drug prevention, drug intervention and education. The physical improvements include the installation of five vapor lights on the west side of the property. The prevention component includes the continued employment of the Resident Services Coordinator and the Intercultural Services Coordinator to provide educational programming and youth activities. Partnerships will be established to provide education to strengthen the individuals and families to reduce the potential for drug use. The intervention component includes contracting for services to provide programming to reduce the number of domestic violence incidents and provide computer classes for adult residents.

The plan proposes a combination of physical security improvements along with a resident oriented drug prevention program. The overall objective is to provide residents with a community that is safe and secure from local drug related activity while at the same time enhancing resident awareness and understanding of the dangers of drugs.

The Drug and Crime Elimination plan at Better Housing includes both physical improvements as well as drug prevention.
