This program also focuses on economic development through the rehabilitation of the John E. Williams Educational Center which will house a police min-station. A day care center and other community programs.

Other initiative partners are the Hampden County District

Attorney's Office, the Mayor's Office, Community Development, the Springfield Chamber of Commerce, Springfield Business Improvement District (SBID), the Department of Probation and Parole, the Springfield Housing Authority, and the Armory Commons Quadrangle Association. Kalamazoo

Interfaith Homes of Kalamazoo, Inc. and Alamo Hills Apartments, both located Kalamazoo, Michigan, have been targeted to receive enhanced community policing and prosecutorial services. Through funds awarded by the New Approach Anti-Drug Program, these developments will benefit from two NLO-STAR officers (Neighborhood Liaison Officers providing Service That Accommodates Residents) who will spend 70 percent of their time in the developments serving approximately 420 low income households. Bainbridge Apartments

\$250,000

The Armour Boulevard Neighborhood consists of 32 city blocks located in the heart of midtown Kansas City. The Armour Boulevard Task Force will use a comprehensive action plan to reduce/eliminate drug activities and drug-related crimes in the neighborhood. This will be accomplished through improvements such as supplemental exterior lighting, contracted security personnel, participation in police programs, two new additions to the community policing efforts in the neighborhood and expanded education classes for the Neighborhood Networks Center.

Mission

NEF Management, Inc.

\$249,120

The Hawthorne Community is located in the Northeastern area of the City of Independence, MO. The targeted population total is 17,000 people. This community consists of Hawthorne Place Apartments and Townhomes which is a 745 unit Section 8 subsidized development. The funds requested will be used in conjunction with the FY 1999 NAADP grant award. Hawthorne will hire two Independence community police officers, one Jackson County School Resource Officer, and begin development of the Neighborhood Networks Center. The funds will affect over 17,000 people, 80 businesses, six churches and seven schools.

Blue Valley Court Townhomes is located in Kansas City and has 164 units. Blue Valley's goal is to improve the safety and quality of life for residents and the neighborhood. The funds will be used to provide fencing between the two properties and keep the criminal element from alluding the police; contract with Federal Housing Patrol to provide security guards; and construct a guard house used by the security guards.

St. Joseph

Housing Authority City of St. Joseph

\$219,000

The St. Joseph Housing Authority and Oakridge Apartments along with approximately 444 residents and neighbors have formed a partnership with the St. Joseph Police Department, Buchanan County Drug Strike Force, and the Buchanan County Prosecuting Attorney's Office. The grant funds will be used to hire two St. Joseph Police Officers to provide services over and above current baseline services for both complexes and neighborhoods. An investigator will be hired to facilitate the investigation and coordinate all law enforcement activities leading to the arrest and prosecution of criminals. Together these partnerships will help decrease the amount of drugs and criminal activity within the assisted properties and neighborhood.

NEW JERSEY

Pierce Manor Of Elizabeth Associates

\$139,557

The purpose of this grant is to increase the presence of the Elizabeth Police Department in the subject neighborhood, benefiting not only the assisted households of Oakwood Plaza Apartments, but for the surrounding community as well. The primary goal is to achieve a reduction in drugs and drug-related crime through increased arrests and prosecution efforts.

Englewood

Westmoor Gardens , Inc.

\$240,000

The purpose of this grant is to develop a comprehensive drug elimination program that incorporates an extensive number of partners. The proposed plan will benefit not only the assisted households of Skyline Gardens, Robert Whalen Homes and Ida Yarbrough Homes, but the surrounding community as well. The primary goal is to achieve a reduction in drugs and drug-related crime through increased surveillance, arrest and prosecution efforts.

Bleeker Terrace Apartments and its management entity, Selective Properties of the Northeast (formerly Las Realty Management), in conjunction with 400 Central Towers, the Office of the Mayor, Albany Police Department, the Albany Housing Authority, and the Albany County District Attorney's Office have formed the Bleeker Safe Neighborhood Partnership (the partnership) in an effort to design and implement a comprehensive crime prevention and elimination plan for the Bleeker Neighborhood.

Through communication and cooperative, Jackson Terrace Associates will endeavor to maximize the grant resources and in doing so will create a model to achieve a lasting solution to the crime problem in the neighborhood.

The purpose of this grant to combat drugs and drug-related crime in the South Franklin Street Corridor-Census Tract 4070 in the Village of Hempstead. The grant funds will be used to provide increased police patrols and physical improvements. The community involvement includes the owner of Pine Town Houses, community residents, the Long Beach Police Department, the Long Beach Housing Authority, the Long Beach Martin Luther King Center, Inc., and the County Prosecutor of Nassau County in a three phased program that leverages existing resources in the community. Proposed activities include: 1) the expansion of the existing drug task force by the Long Beach Police Department which will have the exclusive responsibility for the elimination of illegal drug use and drug-related crime in the target neighborhood; 2) additional efforts by the county prosecutor to reduce the backlog of drug related cases from the target neighborhood and to expedite the processing of new cases; and 3) the creation of a neighborhood networks computer learning center at the Martin Luther King Center to provide basic computer skills to children, youth and adults from the target neighborhood to reduce unemployment and underemployment and to improve school performance and reduce the school drop-out rate. The overall program goal is to remove or reduce the drug culture from the target neighborhood by providing positive experiences for children, youth and adults that will bridge their way into the economic and social mainstream.

The purpose of this grant is to undertake a comprehensive, coordinated community based approach to eliminate drug-related criminal activity through the expansion of existing partnerships with local governmental and not-for-profit agencies. who are in the extremely low- to low-income range. This approach will include augmentation of security services, above baseline services provided by the City of Madison Police Department and by the Dane County District Attorney's office to investigate and prosecute drug-related criminal activity. CDA is partnering with the neighborhood resident associations, the City of Madison, Dane County and other public and private community service agencies.

Rhineland

Wisconsin Housing preservation Trust

The major element of the proposed plan include the creation of a full time drug investigator for the project neighborhood, capital improvements to enhance safety/security at the Highland Estates and Rhine Haus Developments, and the coordination between 10 partnership organizations and 20 regional law enforcement agencies. Of the 10 partnership organizations, 5 are currently providing extensive programming to address needs for youth and families at risk, including, Forward Service Corporation, Welfare to Work Program, and Family Partners Corrective Thinking workshop and Mentoring programs. The Highland Estates, located across a 7-block area on the City's Westside, is one of four developments receiving section 8 project based assistance. The other federally assisted developments are located in the North Central area of the City and on the Eastside. Due to the location of the developments and the size of the city, the entire population of 7,792 residents will be served by this proposal.
