California

City of San Jose, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$1,325,991.00 to continue providing 14 households with Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) and supportive services to 73 households in Santa Clara County. The project is a joint collaboration with The Health Trust in providing an array of supportive services including case management, treatment adherence, public benefits counseling, and independent living education.

City and County of San Francisco, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$1,510,695.00 to continue providing short-term Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) to 70 rent burdened households annually. In addition, each household receives supportive services, including employment and vocational training, in order to sustain their housing stability. The project is a joint collaboration with the Catholic Charities.

Bernal Heights Housing Corporation, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$477,343.00 to continue the Rita Da Cascia Positive MATCH program which provides Short-Term Rent, Mortgage, and Utility (STRMU) assistance to 10 households annually. Integrated supportive services will assist 80 households annually with services specifically designed for women and their children. The project is a joint collaboration with Catholic Charities.

Illinois

Cornerstone Services Inc., is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$887,238.00 to continue providing 13 households with Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) and supportive services for persons living with HIV/AIDS, who also have mental illness and are experiencing homelessness in Will County, Illinois.

Kentucky

Kentucky Housing Corporation, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$455,870.00 to continue providing 222 households with homeless prevention assistance through Short-Term Rent, Mortgage, and Utility (STRMU) assistance and supportive services throughout the Commonwealth to 334 households throughout the grant period. The project is a partnership with AIDS Volunteers, Inc., LivWell Community Health Services, and the Volunteers of America Mid-States, Inc.

Louisiana

UNITY of Greater New Orleans, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing replacement grant of \$834,877.00 to provide 21 households with tenant-based rental assistance, 8 households with STRMU assistance, 5 households with permanent housing placement services, and 60 households with supportive services annually. The project brings three key partners, UNITY of Greater New Orleans, Priority Health Care, and Crescent Care together to expand housing opportunities in New Orleans and Jefferson Parish.

Massachusetts

Justice Resource Institute, Inc., is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$1,449,041.00 to continue providing 39 households with Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) and 78 households with supportive services annually in communities throughout Plymouth, Bristol, and Northern Essex counties. JRI will continue its collaborative partnership with its project sponsors Community Teamwork Inc., Housing Solutions of Southeastern Massachusetts, North Shore Community Action Program, and Seven Hills Behavioral Health. In addition to helping clients find and maintain housing, JRI's case managers strive to help clients become self-sufficient by helping them access income supports and other mainstream benefits, and linking clients to HIV primary care and medications.

City of Baltimore, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$1,491,649.00 to continue providing tenant based rental assistance to 70 households over the three-year grant period to post-incarcerated individuals. This program increases self-determination of post-incarcerated individuals by providing housing referrals and supportive services to transition ex-offenders who are homeless into successful community re-entry.

Oregon

Cascade AIDS Project, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$1,048,104.00 to continue providing 14 units of facility-based housing and Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) to 9 households annually. Supportive services will assist 32 households annually. In addition, two households will receive permanent housing placement annually.

Oregon Health Authority, is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing replacement grant of \$1,299,154.00 to provide scattered-site Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) and supportive services annually to 45 households living with HIV/AIDS who have co-occurring mental illness. The program is a collaborative partnership with Cascade AIDS Project and Cascadia Behavioral Health.

Pennsylvania

Public Health Management Corporation, Inc. is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$872,358.00 for its tenant-based rental assistance program. The program will deliver tenant-based rental assistance, permanent housing placement, supportive services, and housing information for 18 households over the three-year grant period. The project provides clients with supportive services to maintain stable housing by addressing mental health, nutrition, life skills, education, and job training.

Rhode Island

State of Rhode Island Office of Housing and Community Development (Sunrise Project), is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$1,307,563.00 to continue their Sunrise project that includes operation of 13 units of facility-based housing and 19

scattered-site master-lease units. Supportive services will assist 38 households annually. The program is a collaborative partnership with AIDS Care Ocean State in Providence.

State of Rhode Island Office of Housing and Community Development (New

Transitions), is awarded a HOPWA permanent supportive housing renewal grant of \$776,070.00 to continue their New Transitions project that includes a five-unit transitional substance abuse treatment facility and six scattered-site leased units. Supportive services will assist 15 households annually. This is a collaborative partnership with AIDS Care Ocean State which provides substance abuse treatment, intensive supportive services, and Life Skills training for approximately three months, after which clients move to their own apartments with the support of a supportive service network to ensure housing stability.
