Why is HUD publishing a Correction NOFA for NSP2 now?

The Correction NOFA is intended to address an inconsistency in NOFA language of consortium applicants in fundable range—Office of Block Grant Assistance (OBGA) has identified an inconsistency in the NOFA language regarding notifications of awards.

Page 11 of NOFA states that consortium funding agreements are to be executed after consortiums have been selected to receive an NSP2 award, but before HUD awards a grant to the consortium.

Page 32 of NOFA states that consortium funding agreements are to be executed and submitted to HUD based <u>only on</u> achieving a fundable range score of at least 115 points, not on selection to receive an NSP2 award.

In an effort to address the inconsistency, HUD is extending the date for submission of consortium funding agreements by selected consortiums to **January 29, 2010**. HUD notes that this clarification eliminates an administrative burden for those applicants in the fundable range who are not ultimately selected for funding.

When will HUD announce the NSP2 awardees?

HUD expects to announce NSP2 awards sometime in December 2009. Please check HUD's website for further information.

Will NSP2 applicants that do not receive awards be given written notification?

Yes. NSP2 applicants that do not receive an award will be notified <u>after</u> all awards have been announced and funds have been obligated.

Will HUD publish a comprehensive list of NSP2 applicants?

Yes. A list of all NSP2 applications that HUD received will be available to the public <u>after</u> awards have been announced and funds have been obligated.
